FOUNDATION

LITERACY

In foundation our students are been busy doing lots of fun activities. For writing we have been writing about different natural disasters such as floods. The students have also been working on the hearing and recording sounds in class as well. It is great to see so many of our students trying their hardest each day in class.

NUMERACY

In numeracy we are learning about sharing. We have been continuing to learn to share by 1's and create equal groups of objects. We have also been working on measurement learning to compare objects using in-formal units of measurement. We have been impressed with all the hard work the students have put in.

INQUIRY

In inquiry we are investigating the weather looking at the seasons and the different weather that happens during each season. We have also been looking at the natural disasters, in particular floods, learning about the water cycle and the conditions required for floods to occur. The students in looking at floods have explored the different types of floods and the dangers which are associated with them in class. Well done everyone.



YEAR ONE

LITERACY

In reading we have been busy making and reading words. Take a look at our class brainstorm below. We have also been learning about suffixes. Suffixes are parts of words that change the meaning of a word and are found at the end of a base word. The students have been adding these suffixes to base words (s, es, ed, ing). They have learnt that you must drop the 'e' when adding the 'ing' suffix to a word that ends in a silent 'e' (e.g. bake turns to baking).

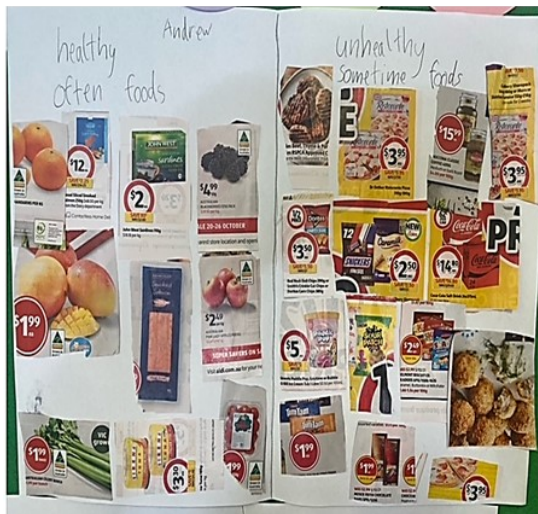


NUMERACY

The grade ones have been sorting data and then placing the data into picture graphs and bar graphs. They have interpreted the data and answered questions such as which had the most/least and what is the difference between two groups.

INQUIRY

The students have been learning about healthy habits such as growing your own fruits and vegetables. Many of the grade ones shared the different plants and trees that they have planted at home with their parents such as tomatoes, basil, lemons and parsley. We discussed important steps that we can take to keep our plants healthy such as giving them water, sunlight and plant food when needed. The grade ones had so much fun planting their very own sunflower seeds. They have now sprouted and the students can't wait to take them home.



YEAR TWO

LITERACY

In reading the Year Two students have continued to return to and respond to texts. We have been identifying the question being asked and returning to the text to find answers. Students are beginning to record answers using full sentences. We have been exploring the use of conjunctions in texts.

In writing the Year Two students have been learning about persuasive texts. We have been learning about the structure and features within this text type. Students are continuing to build their sentence starters.

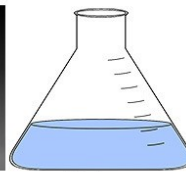
NUMERACY

In maths the Year Two students have been learning to solve number pattern problems. We have been using a think board to show a range of strategies to solve a problem and show our working out. Students are continuing to build on their knowledge of measurement, exploring mass and volume.

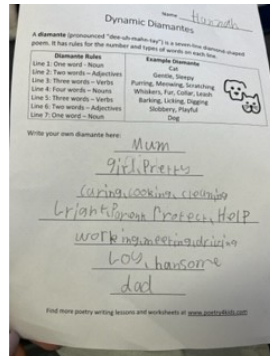
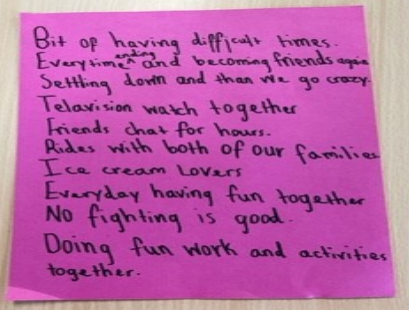
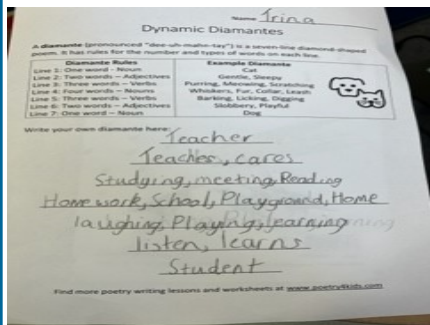
In inquiry the Year Two students are presenting their findings on the big question, 'How do our choices effect our health?'. Students are beginning to create their presentations of what they have learnt throughout the unit.



YEAR THREE & FOUR

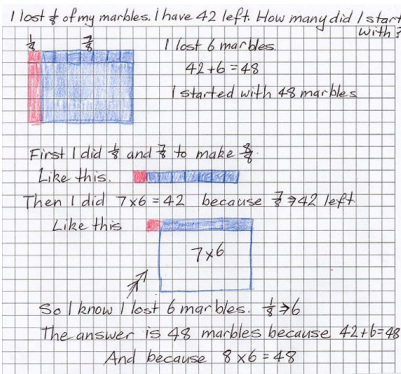
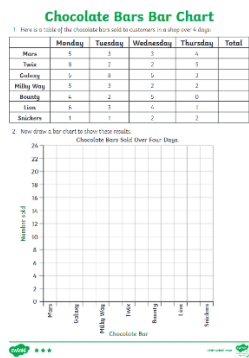
LITERACY

In literacy, students explored language features and poetry. They explore how authors use adjectives, verbs, sentence length and dialogue in their texts to convey meaning. Students identified the features and structures of a range of poems. They composed and published a range of poetry, including Haiku, Diamante, Acrostic and Cinquain.



NUMERACY

In numeracy, students investigated collection of fractions. They began to identify and represent fractions of a collection. They ordered halves, quarters and eighths placed them on a number line. Students also represented data by asking a question and collecting data about a topic of their choice.

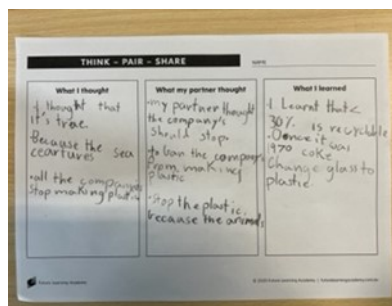


INQUIRY

This term's inquiry is a scientific investigation into the world of matter including reversible and irreversible changes and identifying our needs and priorities. Students explored the Minecraft world, they researched the problem and proactive steps you can take using resources like WWF's Food Waste Warrior Tool Kit. Students also used tools like the board and camera to document their work and identify changes in the Minecraft World including the importance and urgency of each changes they would like to implement.

LITERACY

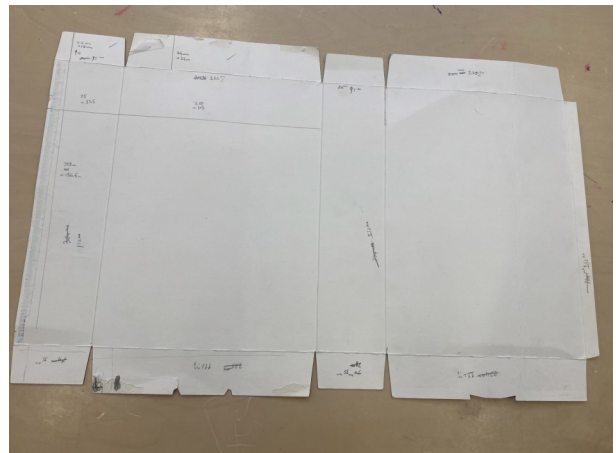
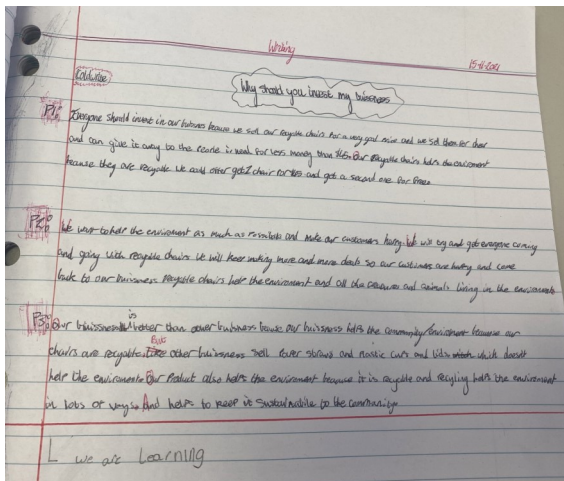
In writing, students have been publishing their persuasive pieces so then they can convince potential investors to invest in their business. They have been creating reasons and examples and organising their structures. In reading students have been learning to connect the titles, headings and headings to a text.

NUMERACY

In maths students have been using their problem-solving skills to solve worded problems. Students have been enjoying connecting these skills to real world situations. Students have been investigating transformations and location through creating a replica of a cardboard box in the classroom. Students have been making a box to scale and will continue their investigations next week.

INQUIRY

In Inquiry, students are continuing their business plan and putting their ideas into action. They are collecting materials to make prototypes in the classroom, such as, lemonade, shoe racks and ice cream shops. Students have also started creating advertisements, logos and jingles to create brand awareness.

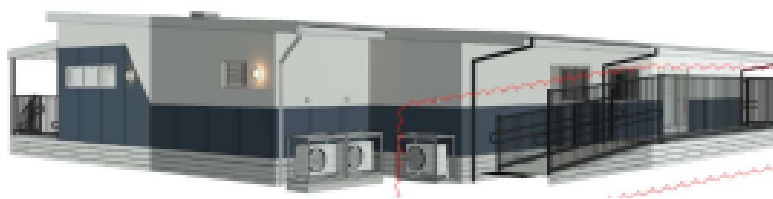

Building Blocks facility expansion at Upfield Kindergarten

Information for Families



Upfield Kindergarten @ Dallas Brooks Community Primary School will soon receive an exciting expansion and upgrade through the Victorian Government's 'Building Blocks' initiative, to provide additional space for delivery of 3-year-old kindergarten programs from 2022. A new modular kindergarten room will be added to the site, and the outdoor play space will be upgraded to make it accessible for all children and provide better spaces for children to engage in nature, be active, explore, play, or to relax.



Key dates & facts:

- Construction starts mid Sept 2021
- Due to be completed by Dec 2021
- The kindergarten program will continue to run throughout the project.

Impact on the kindergarten program

Kindergarten programs will continue to run as normal, however children will access the school playground (while the kindergarten outdoor play space is being upgraded).

Educators will help children understand the upcoming changes in the lead up to the holidays.

Families can also help children prepare for the changes by reminding children over the holidays that the kindergarten will look different when they return. We hope that children will return feeling excited to watch their new play space being constructed!

Safety and risk management

Children's safety is always our first concern – including during the construction period for this project.

Building Blocks facility upgrades at Dallas Brooks PS Kindergarten

Information for Families



Dallas Brooks PS Kindergarten will soon receive an exciting upgrade through the Victorian Government's 'Building Blocks' initiative, to improve the quality of the outdoor play space. This will include improved screening from the busy school yard, as well as creating better spaces for children to be active by running or playing ball games or to engage in quiet play in nature.

- All kindergarten programs will continue to run throughout.

Impact on the kindergarten program

Kindergarten programs will continue to run as normal. Most of the construction will happen over the Term 3/4 holidays, however children will access the school playground for a short time while works are completed.

Children will be able to see the changes occurring to their outdoor play space upon returning to the kindergarten after the term break.

Educators will help children understand the changes as the construction is happening after the school holidays.

Families can also help children prepare for the change by reminding children over the holidays that the outdoor play space will look different when they return to kindergarten. We hope that children will return feeling excited to see their new play space emerge!
